flagship programs. The inaugural year for GHI's Conflict Medicine Program (CMP) was a memorable one, in terms of research, outreach, and activities. The CMP team worked tirelessly to bring together knowledge and practice in the field of conflict medicine, which is more relevant today than ever before, and particularly in the MENA region. Going into 2018, the GHI is dedicated to advancing knowledge and expanding the field of conflict medicine. We intend to do so through close collaborations with key partners on relevant research and contextualized capacity on ecologies of war within the GHI Academy.

Omar Dewachi is Assistant Professor of Anthropology, Social Medicine and Global Health at the American University of Beirut (AUB). Trained as a physician in Iraq during the 1990s, he received his doctorate in social anthropology from Harvard University in 2008. He has conducted extensive fieldwork on the human, social, and environmental impacts of decades of sanctions and military interventions in Iraq—including the exodus of Iraqi doctors, the breakdown of state medical infrastructure, and the long-term toxic legacies of war.

CORE **EXPERT PROFILE** OMAR DEWACHI, MBChB, PhD CMP Co-Director He is the author of Ungovernable Life: Mandatory Medicine and Statecraft in Iraq (Stanford University Press, 2017), which is the first historical and ethnographic study documenting the rise and fall of state medicine in Iraq. 
