

Dr. Boonchai Kijisanayotin is an informatician and physician from Thailand. He had worked in a rural public general hospital for 15 years as an internal medicine clinician before receiving Master and PhD in Health Informatics from University of Minnesota, USA. His working areas and research interest are national health information standards and interoperability, health information exchanges, national eHealth strategy and health IT adoption and CRVS. Currently, he is the manager and health informatician at the Thai Health Information Standards Development Center (THIS), an agency of Health System Research Institute (HSRI), Ministry of Public Health Thailand. He is the lead developer of the Thai Medicines Terminology (TMT), Thailand national drug codes. He was the principal investigator of Thailand eHealth assessment project in 2009 which funded by WHO and the assessment of Thailand Civil Registration and Vital Statistics project in 2013 which funded by UNESCAP.

He is the Chair of the Asian eHealth Information Network (AeHIN) and the vice president of the Thai Medical Informatics Association (TMI). AeHIN promotes better use of information communication technology (ICT) to achieve better health through peer-to-peer assistance, knowledge sharing and learning through a regional approach for greater country-level impacts across South and Southeast Asia., He and AeHIN governing committee lead and initiate several eHealth activities in Asia regions. The activities include, working and collaborating with developing partners e.g. WHO, ADB to organize training course on eHealth for countries' representatives, and have organized five annual international eHealth conference and AeHIN general meeting.
